Hadith of the Month: Volunteer Fasting of the Prohpet

سُئِلَ عَنْ صَوْمِ يَوْمِ عَرَفَةَ. قَالَ: " يُكْفِرُ السَّنَةَ الْمَاضِيَةَ وَالْبَاقِيَةَ ", وَسُئِلَ عَنْ صِيَامِ يَوْمِ عَاشُورَاءَ. قَالَ: " يُكْفِرُ السَّنَةَ الْمَاضِيَةَ " وَسُئِلَ عَنْ صَوْمِ يَوْمِ الْاِثْنَيْنِ, قَالَ: " ذَلِكَ يَوْمٌ وُلِدْتُ فِيهِ, وَبُعِثْتُ فِيهِ, أَوْ أُنزِلَ عَلَيَّ فِيهِ " رَوَاهُ مُسْلِمٌ

The Messenger of Allah was asked about fasting on the Arafah day. He replied, "Fasting of the day of Arafah is an expiation for the preceding year and the following year." and he was asked about fasting on the day of Ashura (the 10th of Muharram). He replied, "Fasting Ashura is an expiation for the preceding year." Then, He was asked about fasting on Mondays, he replied, "This is the day on which I was appointed or I received the Revelation.

Another Report: The deeds are presented on Monday and Thursday. Thus, I love for my deeds to be presented to Allah while I am fasting." (Muslim 1162, 197, and Others)
